John Anthony Ciardi was born June 24, 1916 in Boston. He was an American poet, translator and etimologist. He translated Denter's Divine comedy, he wrote several volumes of poetry for children, etymology pursued, contributed to Saturday Review as a columnist and long time Editor of Poetry, and directed the Bread Loaf Writers conference in Vermont. In 1959, Ciardi published a book on how to read, write and teach poetry, how does a medium poetry, who has been shown to be among the most used books like this. He attended Bates College of Lewiston, Maine and Tufts University in Boston, where he studied under the poet John Holmes. He holds his degree in 1938, and won a scholarship for the University of Michigan, where he received a master's degree in the following year and won the first of many prizes for his poetry, for example, the prestigious award Hopwood. Ciardi taught at the University of Kansas City before joining the United States Army Air Force in 1942. It was resigned in October 1945 with the degree of technical sergeant. After the war, Mr. Ciardi came back briefly to Kansas State, before being appointed instructor in 1946, and later assistant professor, on the Briggs Copeland chair at Harvard University, where he remained until 1953. Ciardi had published his first book of poems, homeward in America, in 1940, before the war, and his next book, other heavens, focusing on his war experiences, was published in 1947. He had begun to translate Dante for his Harvard lessons and has Continued with work for all its time there. His own translation of hell was published in 1954. Translation of Ciardi del Purgatory followed in 1961 and paradise in 1970. John Ciardi died Sunday of Easter in 1986 for a cardiac attack. Miller Williams was born on 8 April 1930 in Hoxie, Arkansas. He holds a degree in biology from Arkansas State University and a master's degree in Zoology at the University of Arkansas. He taught biology at different colleges before obtaining a workplace in the English department of Louisiana State University in 1962. He united the university of the Arkansas' English department in 1970 and remained a professor emeritus until he died of him . His first collection of poems, etc., was published in 1952. During his life, he wrote over 25 harvests in poetry, including a stone circle, halfway between Hoxie, the boys on their bony mules, points Departure, the ways Tocchiamo: Poems, and the time and inclination of the earth: Poems. He received a prize of 1991 poets to live on the surface and the National Arts award for him contributed to him throughout his life. He also worked as a translator and publisher and continued to co-found the University of Arkansas Press, which he directed for two decades. He read him poetry of him, history and hope, in the second inauguration of President Bill Clinton.
